


#### **SNAP E&T PARTICIPANTS & ELIGIBILITY RECAP**

- SNAP E&T eligibility starts with receiving SNAP but not TANF.
- Providers can assist participants apply for SNAP although it is not a SNAP E&T reimbursable activity.
- Receiving SNAP benefits participants with food assistance and can offer potential funding for the SNAP E&T provider.
- SNAP E&T participants are typically a subset of all the participants you serve.
- Estimating the number/percentage of SNAP participants you serve helps to determine your alignment as a provider and will be required as a provider.
- Learning about your state's referral processes for SNAP E&T is important.
- As a provider you will need to integrate screening for SNAP, SNAP E&T eligibility and verification into your program entry process.
- Staff training on SNAP eligibility, applying for SNAP and maintaining eligibility will be needed.
- ABAWDs are a subset of the eligible SNAP population with a work requirement and reporting requirements. SNAP
   E&T aids in meeting the ABAWD work requirement.

- Who at the state/county level do you need to contact?
- Is there an RFP process and what is the schedule?
- Does your state use an intermediary?











#### **EXTERNAL ALIGNMENT**

Below are five action steps to better understand the SNAP E&T opportunity in your local area.

Meet with your SNAP E&T Agency

Talk with other organizations in your region that are current providers

Connect with your Technical Assistance Team as needed

Review the SNAP E&T Provider Handbook, if available

Review the state/county annual SNAP E&T plan










#### **SNAP E&T ADMINISTERING AGENCY**

Meeting with your SNAP E&T Agency can be an important first step. Every Program Is Unique!

Some Agencies Leverage Intermediaries



All States are **required to operate SNAP E&T programs** and they have **flexibility in designing programs** that meet their communities' needs. State SNAP agencies are typically located within the state's Department of Human Services (name of the agency can vary by state). States may also utilize an intermediary to assist with administering their SNAP E&T program.

States often work with orgs who provide employment & training services to SNAP participants as **third-party 50/50 partners**. These partners can be Community Based Organizations (CBOs), Colleges and Employee Based Social Enterprises.

#### **READ THROUGH YOUR SNAP E&T STATE PLAN**

#### What's in the State Plan?

- Every state needs to submit a SNAP E&T State Plan, which outlines the vision, planned growth, and goals for their SNAP E&T program
- This includes the role of third-party providers, and which partners the state will engage during the program year
- The plan also determines which components are offered in the state, as well as any specific requirements for reporting or service delivery

#### **Planning Cycle & Timeline**

- SNAP E&T programs run on the Federal Fiscal year from Oct 1 Sep 30
- Typical partner submission is Late Spring for States to submit to FNS by Aug 15









#### **NEXT STEPS TO BECOMING A SNAP E&T PROVIDER**



#### These Items are True:

Pull together your cross-department team to develop your SNAP E&T pitch, proposal and budget. For example – program team, fiscal, administration, data, quality assurance & development









#### **APPLYING TO BECOME A SNAP E&T PROVIDER**

#### The proposal will seek information about:

#### Your Employment and Training Services

- Employment and Training Services
- Case Management and Supportive Services

#### **People Your Organization Services**

- On SNAP or SNAP eligible, but not on TANF
- Demographics and Focus Populations

#### **Funding Used to Deliver Services**

- Non-federal funds to cover your services
- Funding Diversity & Sustainability

#### Your Administrative Infrastructure

Experience managing funding streams, fiscal and data collection capacity

Note: SNAP agencies may ask for other specific information that they may find important or need to request due to other requirements




